“Whole Society Approach”

New York declaration

- A momentum was created on 19 September 2016 for improved collective responses to refugee crisis making a positive difference in the lives of refugees. Providing them with more and better solutions and protection

The Whole-Society-Approach

A key pillar of the CRRF

- Calls for more equitable-responsibility sharing
- Calls for enhanced, comprehensive, predictable and sustainable responses
- Multi stakeholder approach that includes a broader range of actors to deliver on more sustainable and predictable responses to refugee movement

Whole- Of -Society

- Reinforcing a Whole-of-Government approach (integrated government responses, national and sub-national authorities)
- Mobilizing new/additional actors and resources (development actors, financial institutions, private sector)
- Including refugees and host communities
“ We must ensure that refugees are included not just as beneficiaries but as real actors” HC

A humanitarian NGO Perspective on WoSA

- WoSA to build on and strengthen existing standards and principles
- WoSA to aim to deliver “humanitarian speed with development depth”
- WoSA to rely on relevant structures and mechanisms
- WoSA to be based on improved information dissemination about the CRRF

What can humanitarian NGOs bring to the WoSA

- Not so new way of working for NGOs
- NGOs and responsibility sharing
- Contribute to localizing the CRRF and proper information dissemination

- The WoSA has the potential of broadening the partnership space, developing new partnerships and placing local actors, civil society and refugees at the center
- More needs to be done to ensure inclusion of refugees and host communities in the processes, at the country, regional, and global levels
- ICVA and NGOs community are ready to commit themselves, including through accountability mechanisms, to support the development of the CRRF and the Global Compact on Refugees through a WoSA
